

EASTER MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

"May the light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and mind" - Easter Vigil the lighting of the Paschal Candle from the Easter fire.

Brothers and Sisters:

The past few years have been challenging, from Covid 19 to the divide between individuals who espouse different political views to the challenge of living out our Catholic faith in the world today that does not want to hear about. It is easy to lose the hope we have in Jesus Christ. But, as the above phrase from the Easter Vigil, we must allow Christ's light to dispel the darkness and doubt that may arise in our hearts. It is not easy to live an authentic Catholic Christian life. However, if we allow ourselves to use these challenges and treat them as our passion, untied with the Lord in his risen glory, we can overcome any darkness in our minds and hearts. It is allowing the light of Christ into our minds and hearts so that we can live out our faith with the security of knowing that he will lead us to be with the resurrected Lord in Heaven.

SUNDAY REFLECTION

In today's world we equate mystery with a puzzle to be solved: follow the clues and the solution becomes obvious. But John's account of the first Easter morning reveals a more profound understanding of mystery. Mystery is an experience into which we enter. It may Lead to an encounter with the transcendent God.

John's Gospel for Easter morning is rich with emotion. Mary Magdalene, Simon Peter and the other disciple (probably the evangelist himself) each respond differently to the enigma of the empty tomb. When the two male disciples see the burial cloths, they turn around and run back home. While the unnamed disciple, who sees and believes, seems to solve the mystery of the empty tomb, he misses a critical component of the experience - meeting the resurrected Lord.

Mary Magdalene, however, is willing to sit with her confusion and grief. She remains in the dark, weeping and unknowing. She allows mystery to enfold her and thus she encounters the Risen Jesus. Empowered through her experience, she is the herald of the resurrection, announcing, "I have seen the Lord."

As we participate in this Easter Sunday liturgy, we are full of gratitude for the mystery of the Eucharist wherein we encounter the Risen Christ. Let us rejoice and be glad. Alleluia, alleluia! *Excerpt from Living with Christ – Sunday Missal.*

Open Yourself to the Great Encounter

I am not saying there is an easy solution to our ambivalent relationship with God. Solitude is not a solution. It is a direction. The direction is pointed to by the prophet Elijah, who did not find Yahweh in the mighty wind, the earthquake, the fire, but in the still, small voice; this direction, too, is indicated by Jesus, who chose solitude as the place to be with his Father. Every time we enter into solitude we withdraw from our windy, earthquaking, fiery lives and open ourselves to the great encounter. The first thing we often discover in solitude is our own restlessness, our drivenness, and compulsiveness, our urge to act quickly, to make an impact, and to have influence; and often we find it very hard to withstand the temptation to return as quickly as possible to the world of "relevance." But when we persevere with the help of a gentle discipline, we slowly come to hear the still, small voice and to feel the gentle breeze, and so come to know the Lord of our heart, soul, and mind, the Lord who makes us see who we really are.
