FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

God's Plan is filled with surprises that may be different from our own expectations. In today's Gospel, the Angel Gabriel appears to Mary to announce Jesus' birth. The Annunciation is one of these moments in God's plan and Mary's response is a perfect example of how we should welcome God's surprises. In our first reading, David expected that God's promise would involve an earthly kingdom, but God instead had in mind an everlasting kingdom. His

promise to David would be ultimately fulfilled through a humble soul, that of Mary, who trusted completely in the Lord. Mary is bewildered when she first hears the Angel's message. Gabriel reveals to her that she will bear a son who will be both Son of God and Son of David, the promised Messiah. When reassured that the Angel is God's messenger, Mary responds in faith, with a generous and open heart. Mary is the model believer whose deep faith and trust in God are an example for us all to imitate.

When Mary heard the Angel speak, she heard God's voice in that of his messenger. AS we await the birth of our Lord, we are invited to quiet our hearts and listen, as Mary did, for God's voice in our daily lives. Let us walk in her footsteps and be surprised by the ways of God. *Excerpt from Living with Christ.*

My dear friends, we are celebrating Christmas and the gift of God's love to humanity, the birth of his son Jesus. Over the past few years, the world has seemed obsessed with finding fault in everything and everyone who disagrees with my way of thinking. We start to lose sight of the true, good, and beautiful God created in the world. The above quote from A Charlie Brown Christmas had me thinking about how humanity sees the world and how God sees the world. While we tend to look at all that is wrong with the world or an individual, God sees the present beauty. God sees humanity as "not bad at all." In reality, God does not create bad. God knows we need a "little love" to make us beautiful. God shows us his love for us at Christmas by coming to earth in Jesus Christ. In the birth of Jesus, God shows us by putting in the work to make us beautiful for him. It is in the baby Jesus that we see that God has not given up on us but instead is willing to make the ultimate sacrifices for us, to love us to the end, so we understand that we are not bad, we make mistakes, yes, but God is ready to give us a little love to bring out the true good and beauty in us and humanity. Let us make the same effort with those we come into contact with this Christmas season and during the year. As St. Paul says, let us put on the mind of God, let us put on Christ and see that those who cross our paths are not bad; they need a little love.

For those who are experiencing their first Christmas after the death of a loved one and all who are saddened by a loved one not being present because of death, please know that God's love is present to you to bring you consolation and peace. For those who may be alone or abandoned, let the birth of Jesus remind us that God has not abandoned us or humanity. Instead, he has come to share his life in Heaven with us, and this is the "little love" that God offers with the birth of Jesus.

800th ANNIVERSARY of the Crèche (Manger Scene)

In our Parish we have a wonderful crèche (Manger scene) that has been set up by the DiPaolo brothers over many years, with help from other volunteers as well.

"This year is the 800th anniversary of the crèche, which was given to us in 1223, desiring to make the experience of the Christmas story more tangible and accessible, St. Francis sought permission from Pope Honorius III to set up a live nativity. His intention? To eschew the rising materialism of the time and bring focus back to the simple and divine nature of the Christmas story. The Vatican has announced that: From December 8 to February 2, 2024, a plenary indulgence will be granted to anyone who prays in front of a nativity scene, detaches themselves from all sin and takes part in sacramental confession, holy communion and prayer for the intentions of the Pope. At St. Joseph this year we will follow the custom in Europe and not remove the crèche until Fri, Feb 2, 2024 which is the presentation of the Lord.
