SUNDAY REFLECTION

Lent 2023...will this pilgrimage be different than previous years as I prepare for Easter?

From Adam and Eve enticed by the apple, to Jesus baited by Satan, we all face

temptation. Whatever our age, each of us deals with enticements in our daily lives: food, procrastination, sites on a laptop, moodaltering substances or laziness. How did Jesus deal with his trials? He spoke out directly: "away with you, Satan! For it is written, "Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him." Yes we are tested. And when I give into my temptations, I feel defeated, guilty, ashamed, even angry with myself. When I beat myself up, I'm powerless and of not much use to myself or anyone else. However, let's contemplate St Paul's words in today's reading: "Therefore just as one man's trespass led to condemnation for all, so one man's act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all people." The good news, as I enter this Lenten journey, is that Jesus is the one who died for my sins, for the times I succumb to temptation. On Good Friday he paid the price for my sins. This First Sunday of Lent, my prayer is that the next 40 days be a time of growing awareness of who Jesus is in our lives. Excerpt from Living with Christ.
