SUNDAY REFLECTION

As humans, our gaze only extends as far as the material world around us. Our senses can only inform us about the immediate and sensory surroundings. As a result, we formulate certain conclusions about the nature of

existence. In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds his listeners that the perspective of God is immensely greater that what the human senses can take in. God sees into the deep crevices of space and through the eons of time. God's comprehension is infinitely unfathomable for human minds. It can be easy to feel like our immediate concerns are of the utmost importance, but Christ redirects our attentions to concerns that - while beyond our current gaze - are of even greater significance; the moral jeopardy our souls are in. When Christ states "fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell," he does so because the peril of this danger is not evident to us yet, but we need to heed it. Yet Jesus' message has a positive side to it. While there is evil lurking that can ravage our souls, there is also a kingdom that awaits us in God's reality. Those who call on the name of Jesus Christ in this life will be acknowledged by Jesus in the reality to come, a reality far greater and more permanent than this fleeting plane of existence.

ST JOSEPH MOVIE FESTIVAL 2023

Back to the movies at St Joseph beginning Thursday July 6th -13th at 7pm in the church hall with St Peter – (a two-part movie). As a dedicated follower of Christ, Peter spreads the message of the Christians across the land, often staying only one step ahead of those determined to persecute him. As the tension between the Christians and the Romans grows, blood runs in the streets and the apostles lose St. Paul to crucifixion. On the road to Damascus Peter comes face-to face with a stranger who shows him the only way he must put himself on the cross in order to bring peace. Second movie on Thursday July 20th at 7pm is "Mother Teresa, No Greater Love" - Twenty-five years have passed since the death of Mother Teresa of Calcutta, sparking a renewed interest in this spiritual giant of the 20th century. Filmed on 5 continents and featuring unprecedented access to both institutional archives and the apostolates of the Missionaries of Charity, this film reveals not just who Mother Teresa was, but how her singular vision to serve Christ in the poor continues to be realized through the Missionaries of Charity today. This is far more than a documentary. It is at once a soaring tribute to a spiritual icon, a powerful witness of authentic Christian charity, and a guidepost for all who seek hope in our turbulent times. Third Movie on Thursday July 27th is "The Mission" - The Mission is a 1986 British period drama film about the experiences of a Jesuit missionary in 18th-century South America.
