SUNDAY REFLECTION

Ever feel like a lamb among the wolves? These days our wolves aren't people who have never heard of Jesus. They are our family, friends and colleagues who have tried the faith and found it wanting. What do we

tell someone who has heard it all before? What can we say if they think they already know about God and Don't need him?

It might be tempting to shake off the dust and move on, because it seems no matter how we argue, persuade or preach – we cannot convince. But Jesus never told the disciples to convince anyone. He sent them to speak peace, to seek out and be with those who suffer. Who in our community suffers symptoms of apathy, jadedness or despair? Who hungers for a sense of peace, purpose and belonging? It's not up to us to convince them. But we are called to invite them...and to keep inviting them. Jesus wants us to remind those sheep in wolves' clothing of who they truly are and of who Jesus truly is for them. We don't need to be biblical scholars, articulate debaters or even persuasive preachers to do that. All we need is a willing heart to join the psalmist and say, "I will tell what he has done for me." And, thankfully, may the Holy Spirit do the rest. *Excerpt from Living with Christ.*

If you would ask the Desert Fathers why solitude gives birth to compassion, they would say, “Because it makes us die to our neighbor.” At first this answer seems quite disturbing to a modern mind.
